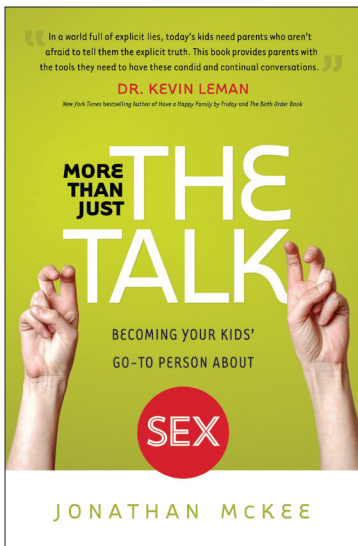




SAMPLE INTERVIEW QUESTIONS

1. Kids today are learning about sex a lot earlier than we think. How soon do most kids learn about sex?
2. Where do most young people look for answers to their questions about sex?
3. Your new book proposes that parents should have “more than just ‘the talk’” with their kids. Why do parents need to have this conversation more often?
4. Your book devotes an entire chapter to “creating a climate for continual conversations” about sex. What do these conversations look like?
5. What is God’s design for sex? Why is it the perfect design?
6. What role do the Internet and social media play in the lies that young people believe about sex?
7. Your book exposes some of the sexually charged messages and images our kids encounter each day at school, with their friends, and on their handheld devices. What are some messages parents should be aware of today?
8. In your experience as an expert on youth culture, what are some of the biggest questions kids are asking about sex, and how do we answer those questions?
9. In addition to *More Than Just the Talk*, you’ve written a companion guide for teenagers titled *Sex Matters*. How can parents use this guide?
10. What one piece of advice can you give to a parent who feels discouraged in their attempts to open up the conversation about sex?

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
