Bestselling Regency Author Julie Klassen Hits Publishing Milestone; Celebrates Jane Austen Convention

Minneapolis, MN—Award-winning, bestselling author Julie Klassen is releasing her tenth novel, The Painter's Daughter, on December 1. The novel received starred reviews from both Library Journal and Booklist, calling it a "gorgeous story of love and redemption" and a "richly nuanced and superbly written inspirational Regency romance."

Her previous release, *The Secret of Pembrooke Park*, was recently honored as a finalist in the Goodreads Choice Awards 2015, one of ten romances chosen out of all of the books published this year. It also won the Minnesota Book Award for genre fiction.

In addition to celebrating this milestone, Klassen recently attended the Jane Austen Society of North America's Annual General Meeting. Over 800 writers, readers, and historians attended the international literary conference, held this year in Louisville, Kentucky.

As well as attending classes about the life and times of the Regency era, attendees enjoyed a tea workshop, Regency style show, and English country dance lessons. Many attended the closing ball attired in Regency finery, including Klassen, whose dress was created according to patterns of the time period. "Because I write novels set in the time period when Austen's novels were published, I see the conference as a chance to conduct research and have fun with fellow Austen enthusiasts," Klassen said of the event.
